
## Security

# Better Care Fund - Lambeth



- The Better Care Fund (BCF) programme was established to help local systems to deliver integration of health and social care through jointly funded Local Authority / CCG initiatives.
- Local areas submit an annual BCF Plan to NHS England and report on progress at year-end for national oversight.
- In 2022, NHS England set the deadline for the Better Care Fund 2021-22 Year End Reporting Template as **27 May 2022** - between local elections on 5 May 2022 and the Lambeth Health and Wellbeing Board date of 23 June 2022.
- On the advice of the NHS national team, Lambeth commissioners agreed to submit the Reporting Template on 27 May 2022 with approval from the DASS and CCG Accountable Officer and with approval in principle from the Health and Wellbeing Board chair, prior to formal review by the Health and Wellbeing Board on 23 June 2022.
- **Proposal is for the Health and Wellbeing Board to formally approve the Lambeth Better Care Fund 2021-22 Year End Report.**

# 2021-2022 End of Year Reporting Template



Following submission of the Lambeth Better Care Fund Plan for 2021-22 in November 2021, the **Better Care Fund 2021-22 Year End Reporting Template** was submitted on 27 May 2022. The template asked for:

- Confirmation that the BCF national conditions continued to be met throughout the year
- Actual income and expenditure in BCF section 75 agreements for 2021-22
- Details of significant successes and challenges during the year
- Details of fee rates paid by councils for social care services that they fund

# 2021-2022 Finance



- The total planned expenditure for Lambeth BCF 2021-22 was **£43,687,276**. The actual expenditure for 2021-22 was **£43,907,760**.
- In 2021-22, actual expenditure exceeded planned expenditure by **£220,484** - this spend attributed to community equipment specifically:
  - The Covid-19 pandemic caused an unprecedented demand for beds and high-risk pressure mattresses, which, along with provision of other equipment, helped to facilitate fast hospital discharges.
  - There has been an increase in community equipment prices.



# 2020-2021 Metrics



For 2021-22 the national conditions and reporting requirements have all been met. Performance against the Better Care Fund metrics is as below:

- **Three** of the **five** metrics are performing **in line with expected performance**
- **One** metric target (Length of Stay) has been **partially met**.
- **One** metric target (Residential Admissions) is reporting **below target performance** due to high numbers of admissions for over 65 admissions to residential/nursing care homes in 21-22.
