On THURSDAY 1ST NOVEMBER 2018 I was on duty in full uniform at BRIXTON police station. My tour of duty was 2200hours the previous day until 0700hours. I was posted to a marked response vehicle, call sign LX86N with PC 646LX SMITH. Around 0330hours we responded to a report of an assault which is recorded on CAD812/01NOV18.

I heard a call over my personal radio to attend 500 BRIXTON ROAD, where the London Ambulance Service had been called to a male with a head injury following an assault.

On my arrival at the scene I could see an ambulance on scene and approached and knocked, entering the ambulance when invited. On board the ambulance, I met a male who I now know to be [redacted] date of birth 11/09/1994 of an address known to police. [redacted] was being treated for a ten centimetre laceration to his head. Whilst talking to him [redacted] alleged that a shopkeeper in the corner shop nearby had caused this. He alleged that there had been a disagreement or misunderstanding over a bottle of drink and then the shopkeeper had taken a metal pole and struck him over the head, causing the injury for which he was receiving treatment. He described the shopkeeper as a Pakistani male, around F505 tall with stubbly facial hair, he was unable to provide a clothing description.

PC SMITH and I, satisfied that he was receiving sufficient care, attended the store to make enquiries. On arriving at the store there were two workers inside, tidying the shop floor, I immediately noted that one of these males matched the description [redacted] had provided. I now know this male to be Dalash Jam MOHAMAD, date of birth [redacted] PC SMITH arrested MOHAMAD on suspicion of causing Grievous Bodily Harm after ascertaining that he was a shop worker and had been present at the scene around the time of the assault.

I implemented a crime scene at the store and the immediate vicinity outside, and during a very brief initial search, under Section 32 of the Police and Criminal Evidence (PACE) Act 1984, being the place where MOHAMAD was at the time of his arrest. I located by the door, two white metal poles, matching the description given by DZSEMEL and I seized them under Section 19 of PACE. I exhibit these as:

- DFB/1 - One (1) white metal pole - MPSS02074227- 105/11450
- DFB/2 - One (1) white metal pole with spots of blood - MPSS02074228- 105/11451

I continued enquiries into CCTV, seeking advice from colleagues at the Met Forensic Command (MFC) and our local CID offices via the radio as to my actions. A manager of the store arrived and was able to show CCTV to me which I viewed. This was later seized and exhibited by a colleague from the manager and exhibited as KS/1.

On this footage I could see MOHAMAD take a metal pole from behind the till area. I conducted a search of this area and located another metal rod which I seized and exhibit as

- DFB/3 - One (1) metal rod - MPSE53695801 - 105/11452

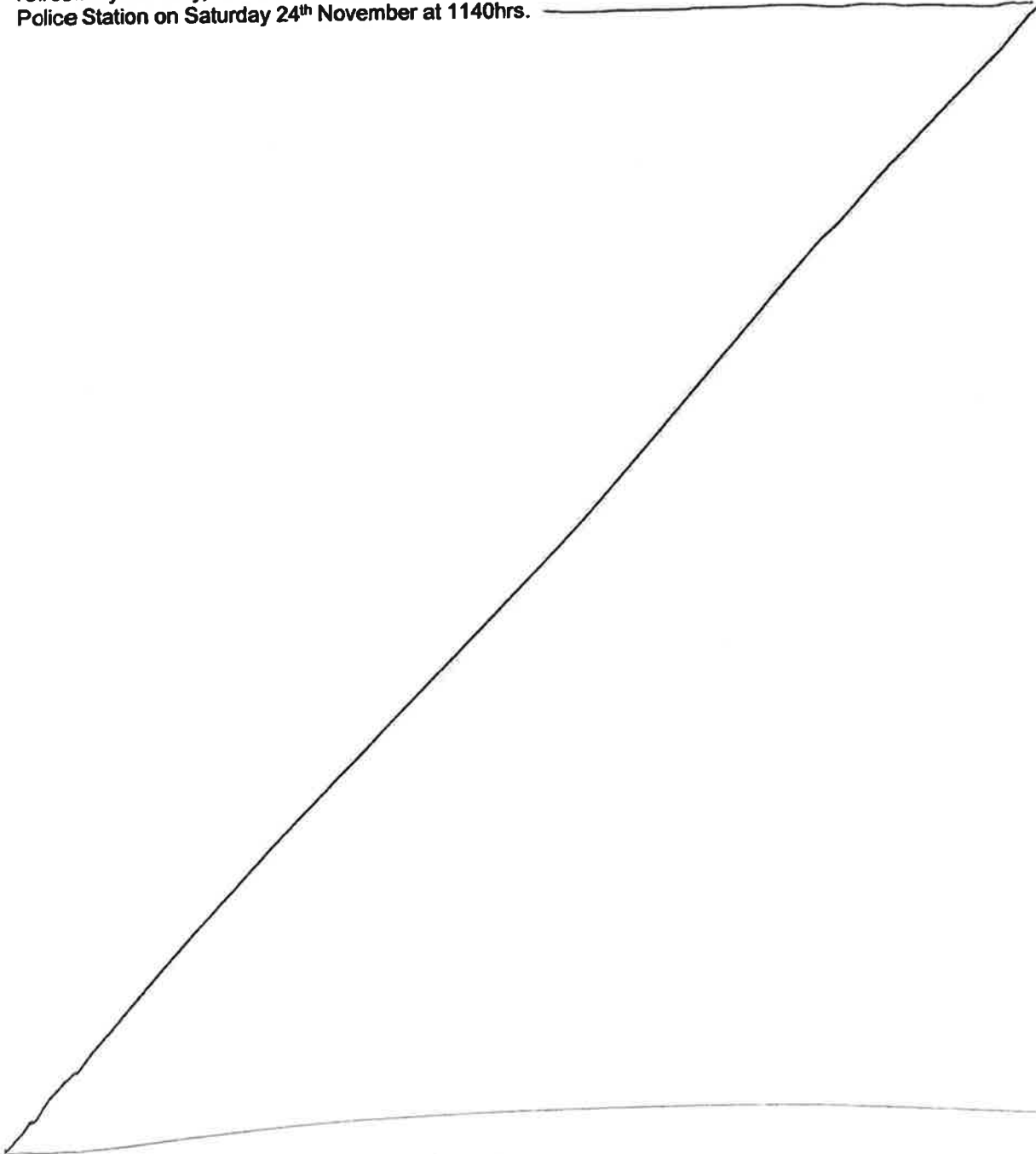


Continuation of Statement of:

On further advice I closed the scene on the authority of DS DENLEY and returned to BRIXTON Police Station to continue with the investigation.

During this matter I activated my bodyworn video camera and recorded four clips of footage. I exhibit these as DFB/4, DFB/5, DFB/6 and DFB/7 – showing the Allegation, Arrest, Search and Victim Injuries respectively. These are all bodyworn video clips, stored digitally.

This statement is written having reviewed the footage detailed above. There has been some lapse of time between the incident and this statement and I have used the CAD, Crime Report (1231857/18) and footage to refresh my memory, I can also recall details of the incident quite clearly. Notes written alone at BRIXTON Police Station on Saturday 24th November at 1140hrs.

The scene of the assault was immediately outside the shop. Due to heavy rain and the time lapse between assault and call, there was no visible blood or scene outside.

Thank you for your email of 12th November to which I now respond.

My client is grateful that you take into consideration the cost of a security guard on the door, and I am therefore asked to respond on the alternative suggestion that there be a window service at certain hours.

This, too, is not fail safe.

First, customers like to browse. This often widens the reason they called ie they buy other grocery items as well as the main item in mind. To justify the cost of being open during the night, browsing is therefore an important aspect of securing the cost does not exceed the benefit.

In practice, my client varies practice according to footfall. On Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays my clients open 24/7. On other nights they use the window counter service 0200 to 0500. This is because fewer staff are needed than when the shop is fully open. My clients are well aware of the failure of another local business operating 24/7 that switched to window counter service for part and who during the time of counter service suffered also from counter grabs.

Again, therefore, as this incident was and is believed to be exceptional and the other measures proposed should hopefully help ensure no repeat, there is no objection to the licence being amended to include all the other conditions you have proposed, excepting still for condition 2.

It is not to make light of what happened but my clients understand upon further enquiry that the customer concerned apart from bad mouthing the member of staff who seems in this case to be at fault in terms of using a 'weapon', also struck him as he left the shop, which I suspect led to the loss of control that followed. It is certainly consistent with the sudden use of a 'weapon' by the staff member, as shown on CCTV. It is for all that, I repeat, an exceptional incident that stands alone in a long record of operation of shops by my clients.

My clients, if it assists, would however, have no issue with staff wearing body cameras 0012 to 0500, as a condition of the licence. This could, I suspect, also intimidate/prevent the initial violence allegedly offered by the customer as a record of actions would be available.

Dear Mr Goldsmith,

Thank you so much for your prompt response following discussions with your clients.

I am pleased that your clients are happy to implement all but one of the proposals that we have made in order to prevent incidents such as this occurring again. It is due to the seriousness of the incident that I strongly recommend that your clients give serious

consideration to proposal number 2. I can appreciate that the hiring of an SIA security would be costly and that a window service would be preferable in these circumstances, but I believe that this service would be better facilitated during the hours of 0000-0500 on a daily basis, when Crime & Disorder is more likely to take place. I believe that if a window service was in operation during these proposed hours the potential of a similar serious offence occurring would be significantly reduced.

If your clients agreed to this proposal, in addition to the proposals already agreed on, we would expect that it would be confirmed by way of a Variation to the license.

Finally, your clients kindly provided the details of the three members of staff that were working at the time of the incident, please could you ask them to confirm which one of the three is Personal License Holder. I meant to ask them during our meeting but totally forgot.

I have now had a discussion with my client and viewed the available CCTV record more than once.

I have also gone through the proposals you made when meeting my clients yesterday.

There is no issue with the proposals save for no 2.

My clients have had this business for some 6 years (and other similar businesses over a much longer period) and there has never been an incident like this before. To engage a security guard is an expensive matter that does not seem warranted for this one incident.

A window counter is already in use between 0200 and 0500 on Sunday to Wednesday both inclusive. This incident happened after 0230 on a Thursday. This reflects the footfall. It is also a potentially expensive option.

The member of staff who continued some argument, it is thought starting with an attempt by the customer to steal, just outside the door and appears to have used an implement he found to hand, was fairly new and was due to be 'let go' as other staff were not quite comfortable working with him. It is unfortunate that this incident should have been the trigger. Lessons have been learned as from any adverse circumstance.

My clients would therefore seek to implement 1, 3, 4, 5, and 6 with immediate effect and will reflect on what other than the proposals in 2 might be both effective and cost effective though at the end of the day a staff member acting on his own coupled with a customer out to cause trouble does not need a shop to be open during the night to occur, indeed, could not reasonably be expected to occur at all, and I think should be seen as a 'freak'.

1. The three employees involved in the incident are no longer to work at the premises with immediate effect and will not work at the premises in the future.

2. SIA Security guard to be employed by the premises and operate between the hours of 2200-0500 daily and have the use of a Body Worn Camera **OR** implement the use of a window counter in the shop front for sales prevent access to the shop for customers.
3. Provide Conflict Resolution training to all members of staff and for this to be reviewed on a 6 monthly basis.
4. Right to Work checks to be conducted on all members of staff and for this to be conducted on a six monthly basis.
5. The premises shop floor shall be cleared and remain free of all metal object's that could be used as a weapon, i.e. the metal pole that is used for the shutters.
6. A full and comprehensive review of the CCTV system by a qualified engineer to ensure that all cameras are working correctly.

All of the above points were proposed to yourselves and discussed at length in the meeting that was held 07/11/18, at The Civic Centre. Each suggestion has been explained in detail and you indicated that you both fully understood each recommendation. If you have any further queries please do not hesitate to make contact with me.

I am the above named person and I am a Police Officer attached to Lambeth's Licensing and Night Time Economy unit and I have been a serving Police Officer on the borough of Lambeth now for a little over 15 years. I write this statement in relation to my dealings with the premises that is LOCAL EXPRESS, 500 Brixton Road, SW9 of which I have sought to review the premises license following an incident that occurred there in the early hours of Thursday 1st November 2018, whereby a customer was the victim of a GBH.

On 01/11/18 I was made aware of the incident that occurred at LOCAL EXPRESS and was informed that one employee from the venue had been arrested on suspicion of causing GBH to a customer. Due to the fact this had taken place within a licensed premises I met with PC Eldridge, who I was informed was the officer responsible for investigating the incident. Upon meeting with PC Eldridge I was shown CCTV footage of the incident that had been obtained from the premises that covered the main shop floor. I was informed that at the time of dealing with the incident officers had requested to see CCTV footage from other cameras within the venue but they were informed these cameras were not working. I viewed the CCTV footage and became immediately aware of the significance of the incident, a serious crime had taken place and employees of the venue were considered as Suspect's for this crime. I made contact with a male, who I now know to be Mr Fawad KARIMI, who is on the premises license as the DPS and requested that he meet with myself, the OIC, a colleague from Licensing and Night Time Economy unit and also member of the council who deals with licensing to discuss the incident at length, to which Mr KARIMI agreed. On 07/11/18, Mr KARIMI and a male who I now know to be Mr Jan MATTEEN, who is the Premises License Holder, attended the Civic Centre in Brixton and the issue was discussed. Mr KARIM and Mr HATTEEN stated that they had not seen the CCTV footage prior to attending the meeting and were relying on the account they had been given from the employees working at the time of the incident, who were being considered as suspects. The seriousness of the offence and incident was relayed to Mr KARIM and Mr MATTEEN and it was also explained to them that the employee arrested at the time of the incident was subsequently found to be in the country illegally and was also being dealt with by immigration authorities despite the fact he had informed officers at the scene he was the manager of the shop. A list of expectations was drawn up and discussed with Mr KARIM and Mr MATTEEN who stated that they believed the list to be fair but requested that the list be put in writing so they could take the time to discuss their options with a solicitor, which was agreed. I believed at this point Mr KARIM and Mr MATTEEN fully understood the seriousness of the matter and were keen to come to a resolution as they verbally indicated that they were happy with the majority of the

proposals expected of them. A letter was emailed to both Mr KARIM and Mr MATTEEN with the following expectations.

1. The three employees involved in the incident are no longer to work at the premises with immediate effect and will not work at the premises in the future.
2. SIA security to be employed by the premises and operate between the hours of 2200 – 0500 daily and have the use of body worn camera or implement the use of a window counter in the shop front for sales to prevent access to the shop for customers.
3. Provide conflict resolution training to all members of staff and for this to be reviewed on a 6 monthly basis.
4. Right to work checks be conducted on all members of staff and for this to be done on a 6 monthly basis.
5. The premises shop floor shall be cleared and remain free of all metal object's that could be used as a weapon i.e. the metal pole that is used for the shutters.
6. A full and comprehensive review of the of the CCTV system by a qualified engineer to ensure that all cameras are working correctly.

Upon receipt of this email Mr MATTEEN responded by stating that he would forward the email to his solicitor for advice. Mr MAATTEEN also provided the details of the two other employees involved in the incident that weren't present when police attended so these details could be forwarded to the officer leading the investigation. On 08/11/18, I received an email from a Mr Peter GOLDSMITH who informed me he was acting on behalf of Mr MATTEEN and he stated that there was no issues with the proposals with the exception of number 2. The reasoning behind this was that in 6 years of operating there had been no incidents like this and that the implementation of this proposal would be very costly based upon one incident. On 12/11/18 I responded to Mr GOLDSMITH and stated that I understood that the hiring of SIA security would be costly and perhaps not as practical as window sales. I stated that I strongly recommended the implantation of window sales between the hours of 0000-0500. I advised that this measure would significantly reduce the risk of a similar incident taking place. I also asked for Mr GOLDSMITH to enquire as to which of the three employees present at the time of the incident was the Premises License Holder, which is required as part of their license. On 20/11/18, I received a response from Mr GOLDSMITH informing me that his client was still unwilling to implement the proposal of window sales between the hours of 0000-0500 based on the potential of loss in earnings and the fact that this has been an isolated incident. Mr GOLDSMITH stated that his client would be prepared to provide staff with body worn cameras between the hours of 0012-0500 to act as a deterrent for crime. Mr GOLDMSITH did not inform me of which employee working at the time of the incident was the PLH.





I am the above named person and I am currently a serving Police Officer attached to Lambeth's Licensing & Night Time Economy Unit. I am making this statement in relation to an incident that occurred at LOCAL EXPRESS, Off License, 500 Brixton Rd, SW9, whereby a customer was the victim of a GBH and employees from the venue were arrested on suspicion of causing the injuries.

Due to my current position on the Licensing and Night Time Economy unit I was contacted by the OIC and informed of the incident with a view to potentially taking actions. On 01/11/18, at approximately 1800 hours I attended Brixton Police Station and viewed CCTV footage of the incident that had been obtained by the reporting officers. The footage showed the victim entering the store and he appeared to be intoxicated. The victim can be seen picking up two bottles of soft drink and appears to place one bottle in a bag and attempts to pay for the other bottle, although this payment does not seem to be authorised and is subsequently declined. At this point the victim is approached by a member of staff, who for the remainder of this statement I shall refer to as SUSP1. SUSP1 challenges the victim and recovers the bottle from his possession before returning the bottle to the shelf. It appears that the victim is now instructed to leave the store by SUSP1 but the victim tries to remonstrate with SUSP1. The victim continues to remonstrate with SUSP1 in what I would describe as a non-confrontational manner but SUSP1 does not appear interested in engaging him in conversation until he eventually shoves the victim in the chest towards the doorway indicating that he wants the victim to leave. The victim again tries to remonstrate with SUSP1 but this time it appears that he is questioning as to why he was shoved by SUSP1 but gets no response. The victim goes to leave the store and whilst he does he walks past SUSP1 and there is slight contact which appears to anger SUSP1 and he responds by picking up a metal object near the doorway and lunges at the victim striking him with the object forcing the two of them onto the shop front out of camera view. Whilst this happens, a second member of staff, who for the remainder of the statement I shall refer to as SUSP2, can be seen on camera holding a skinny metal object behind his back. As SUSP1 begins to attack the victim, a third member of staff, who I shall refer to as SUSP3, appears from behind the counter, takes the metal object from SUSP2 and also lunges in the direction of the victim, although it is unknown if he makes contact with the victim.

I watched the footage approximately 4/5 times in the company with the OIC and a colleague from the Licensing and Night Time Economy unit before we made contact with the venue regarding the incident.
