**LICENSING ACT 2003 -**

**Jey's Offie, 215 Clapham Park Road, LONDON SW4 7EX**

I refer to the licence in respect of the above premises.

We were recently made aware that a license holder by the name of Mr Kandiah Jeyabalasingam has passed away on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2019. Section 27 (1) (A) of the Licensing act 2003 states that A premises licence lapses if the holder of the licence dies. It goes on to state that the licence can be reinstated within 28 days of the death.

On 28<sup>th</sup> May, I was informed that the Police and Council Officers have attended the premises and found that the premises continue to sell alcohol without a valid premises licence in place.

I have done a search of our records to determine as to whether an application to transfer the premises licence was received within the interim 28-day period. I can confirm no such application has been received. Therefore, there can be no licensable activity taking place from this premises.


