Comment:08/09/2021 7:47 AM Whilst I applaud the redevelopment of this neglected corner of Greyhound Lane and creation of a new Sainsbury's store, I have significant concerns about the granting of an alcohol license.

There are extensive problems with street drinking (with the associated littering/public urination) in the area and another outlet selling alcohol (at later hours and potentially at lower costs) could make this worse. This is evidenced close to the existing Co-op store in Streatham Vale, where the bins and planters are peppered with beer cans, and there are often groups of men congregating in the side streets and urinating in back alleys.

In addition, I have regularly witnessed builders/construction workers getting on the train with cans of beer in the early hours of the morning, so a store selling alcohol from 7am will surely only serve to exacerbate this issue.

If a license must be granted, I ask the Council to consider limiting this to sensible hours such as 11am - 10pm, to at least limit the impact on our community.

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Hi Ola

It would be highly unusual for a Sainsbury's store to have start time of 11am. Our client's customers do have a reasonable expectation of being able to buy alcohol during normal opening hours.

Regarding the bottled beer, yes some single bottles are in the range. The idea of this condition is to prohibit the very large bottles of cider seen in other stores. Many of the premium beers tend to be in single bottles.

The hearing date of 4 February will be of some concern to our client. I believe that we have just the single representation and so I should be grateful for any mediation that you can achieve here.

Dear Ola

Thank you for the email and update. Whilst this does go some way to addressing the concerns I have raised, I still believe the sale of alcohol at that time of the morning (before 11am) is inappropriate for the area. The security/CCTV measures listed in the conditions do not prevent individuals buying alcohol and then drinking elsewhere at earlier times of the day. There are regular instances of people boarding trains at Streatham Common with cans or bottles of alcohol, so shops and businesses should not be enabling this.

Can I request a clarification on Condition 10 - does this mean that bottles of beer/cider/ lager between 500ml and 1500ml would be allowed to be sold individually? The 660ml/700ml bottles are often the type seen left in local roads/flower beds by street drinkers. If this condition were to be extended to prevent the sale of **any individual bottles / can of beer/lager/cider**, I would be less concerned about the hours allowing sale.

The hours for sale of alcohol has been reduced to 08:00 – 23:00 hours

Conditions

1. The licence holder will ensure that the premises benefit from a CCTV system that operates at all times when licensable activities are taking place.
 2. The system will incorporate a camera covering each of the entrance doors and the main alcohol display area and will be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard. The precise positions of the cameras may be agreed, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, with the police from time to time.
 3. The system will incorporate a recording facility and any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days and will be made available, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, to the police for inspection on request.
 4. The system must be able to export recorded images to a removable means e.g. CD/DVD and have its own software enabled to allow playback/review.
 5. A member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system must be available at the premises at all times that the premises are open to the public.
 6. The system will display, on any recording, the correct time and date of the recording.
 7. The applicant will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff and security. Such staff and security levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and police.
 8. Signage will be displayed at the exit of the premises requesting customers leaving the premises late at night to do so quietly and with consideration so as not to disturb nearby residents.
 9. The premises licence holder will ensure that an age verification policy will apply to the premises whereby all cashiers will be trained to ask any customer attempting to purchase alcohol, who appears to be under the age of 25 years (or older if the licence holder so elects) to produce, before being sold alcohol, identification being a passport or photocard driving licence bearing a holographic mark or other form or method of identification that complies with any mandatory condition that may apply to this licence.
10. There shall be no sale of single cans of beer, lager or cider from the premises and no single bottles of beer, lager or cider in vessels of less than 500ml or more than 1500ml.
11. There shall be no sale of beer, lager or cider with an ABV content of 5.5% ABV or above save for premium products which have been agreed with the police (email authority will suffice).
12. There shall be no self-service of spirits except for spirit mixtures with an ABV not exceeding 5.5% ABV.
13. The premises shall not sell or supply miniature bottles of spirits of 50ml or less
